SCAPTP Practicum Match

General Student Instructions for Participation

The Basics:

- 1. Use the SCAPTP Directory to select Sites to apply to
- 2. Register for the SCAPTP Match after you receive your invitation
- 3. Build your site list
- 4. Add tracks to your Rank List
- 5. Finalize your Rank List order before the SCAPTP Ranking Deadline
- 6. Wait for SCAPTP Match Day

Full details:

1. Use the SCAPTP Directory to select sites to apply to

- → Your DCT can provide you with a login to browse the SCAPTP Directory
 - ◆ This gives you access before you have a personal PracticumFit Account.
 - ◆ Your directory view will be filtered to sites your school has approved for you.
- → **Apply to sites** using the information provided in the directory.
 - Coordinate with your DCT about any specific procedures or requirements you need to follow in choosing sites to apply for.
 - Most sites use the standard SCAPTP application deadline, but there are some exceptions! Check each site's directory profile to be sure.
- → Interview with sites you applied to. Please note:
 - ◆ You are NOT PERMITTED TO DISCUSS RANKING INTENTIONS with any sites before the match.
 - ◆ Sites should not be discussing their ranking intentions with you, or asking you for information about how you plan to rank them.

2. Register for the SCAPTP Match

- → Your Director of Clinical Training will send you an emailed invitation to register for the SCAPTP Match on PracticumFit.com.
 - ◆ This will happen in January or February, depending on your school.
- → Follow the instructions in the email sent to you from PracticumFit.
 - ◆ Invitation emails come from welcome@practicumfit.com.
- → Use the same email address on your application materials and for match registration.
 - ◆ Agencies often look up students in the system by email address.
 - ◆ Agencies may not be able to find unregistered students on PracticumFit.
 - Many sites use PracticumFit to keep track of their applicants.
 - Waiting a long time to register means it can be hard for sites to keep track
 of unregistered applicants.
- → Cost is \$50 to participate in this year's SCAPTP match cycle.
 - Note that this fee is non-refundable once paid.

3. Build your Site List

- → You can apply to as many sites as you wish in this year's match.
 - ◆ Please note that this may change in future years.
 - SCAPTP does not mandate a minimum number of sites, but be aware that students who apply to very few sites may seriously impact their chances of matching.

3. Add Tracks to your Rank List

- → Make sure you and the site are in agreement about the tracks you are applying to.
 - ◆ If a site has more than one track, and you rank one of its tracks, but it only ranks you in a different track, then there will be no possible way for you to match to the site!

4. Rank your selected tracks:

- → Once you rank your tracks, print a copy, or save a screenshot, and if you have completed your rankings early, double check them before the final deadline.
- → You can update your rank list as many times as you wish, until the ranking deadline
 - ◆ The ranking deadline is posted on SCAPTP.org and on PracticumFit.
 - Once the ranking deadline has passed, you will not be able to make any more changes to your rank list.
- → Inform your DCT and PracticumFit if you need to withdraw from the Match!
 - ◆ If after the application and interview process you do not have any tracks that you can rank, please contact your Field Placement Office.
 - ◆ If for any reason you do not wish to participate in the SCAPTP Match after registering, you must formally Withdraw from the Match.

Frequently Asked Questions about Ranking

→ Q: Which sites should I rank?

- ◆ A: Rank every single site you would be willing to work at, in the order of your honest preference.
 - If, after interviewing at a site, you know that in no way would you ever consider going to that site, do not rank it.
 - Otherwise, you should rank all sites where you interviewed in order to give yourself the best chance to match.

→ Q: Can I tell the site how I plan to rank them? Can I ask how they plan to rank me?

- ◆ A: No! Sites and students are not permitted to discuss ranking intentions, unless it is to inform the other that they will not be ranked at all.
- ◆ Do not tell a site how you plan to rank them.
 - If a site asks you for this information, please let your DCT know.
 - It is ok to tell the site...
 - o ...you'd be very excited to work for them or you plan to rank them.
 - ...you will not be ranking them.
- ◆ Sites should not be discussing their ranking intentions with you.
 - o If a site tells you they plan to rank you #1, they are violating match policy.

- It is ok for the site to say...
 - ...they would be very excited to work with you and that they plan to rank you.
 - ...they will not be ranking you.
- Discussing ranking intentions before the match is a violation of SCAPTP
 Match Policy.

5. Match Day!!

- → Match Day for each year is posted on SCAPTP's website and in PracticumFit.
- → Match results will be emailed around 8am on the SCAPTP match day.
- → You can also log in to PracticumFit to see your results starting at 8am.

Please note: The Match results are Final and students must abide by them. When you rank a track, you are agreeing to go to that site if you match. It is recommended to only rank a site if you are willing to go there.
